Thank you for your interest in the Big Lake Open Team project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America project provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

Big Lake Youth Camp has served as an outdoor sanctuary for summer camps and retreats for the last 54 years. However, the camp experiences harsh winters, which takes a severe toll on the buildings. Many of the structures are now in need of repairs and updates.

On this project, volunteers will continue the renovations and projects that the first 2016 Maranatha group started in May. The biggest project that volunteers will take on is to rebuild the horse barn in order to raise the roof and provide more support to prevent snow damage. In addition, the group will continue to build new cabins for the girl's village and complete landscaping projects around campus. There is plenty to be accomplished, and Maranatha volunteers will be a huge blessing to this camp facility.

Accommodations

Volunteers will stay in available cabins and dorm rooms at Big Lake Youth Camp. Everyone will need to bring their own pillows, twin bed linens, and towels to use during the project. For those bringing RVs, there are ten RV spaces with water and electric hookups. The camp cafeteria will provide meals.

Expenses

The only cost to volunteers is the travel expenses to and from Big Lake Youth Camp. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Area Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Feel free to make your own arrangements for some of these or other popular area attractions.

Crater Lake | Located about two and a half hours south of Big Lake, this pristine mountain lake has beautiful views from the crater rim and hiking trails, as well as water access for those who enjoy swimming, boating, and fishing.

Smith Rock State Park | This state park boasts beautiful views of cliffs, streams, and valleys. There are opportunities for bird watching and walking along the trails. For the more adventurous, there is plenty of rock climbing and biking trails as well. This park is located about 45 minutes east of Big Lake.

Big Lake Youth Camp | Big Lake in and of itself is quite the place! Walk around the lake or enjoy the many hiking trails along the property.

Weather

Average temperatures in Sisters, Oregon, are fairly cool in September. Temperatures range from low 50's to low 60's, but can dip into the 40's at night. Please bring clothing for working outdoors, and be sure to include a light jacket. Weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast prior to your trip to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Sisters.

Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges; however, it does carry a \$250 per occurrence deductible for dental charges.

Medical evacuation	\$250,000
Repatriation (in the event of a death)	\$25,000

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on projects in North America.
