

# What Were BUILDING

## One-Day Church

This program has been critical in responding to the requests for churches in the most isolated parts of the world, where traditional construction would be extremely difficult. Yet One-Day Churches can fill the need by providing a steel frame and roof. Then, church members build the walls with local materials. The cost of a

One-Day Church is \$4,500. You can also sponsor a share for \$1,500.

Education is a tremendous need in the developing world, yet schools are very expensive to construct. The One-Day School is an effective and relatively affordable solution. ### Schools

Maranatha's largest structure is a school called the Education and Evangelism Center (EEC). It is a block construction building, featuring a long open space in the middle with classrooms, restrooms, and offices flanking both sides. The center space can be used as a gymnasium and an auditorium. The EEC can have six to twelve classrooms, with room for 40 students per room. Cost for this building can range from \$500,000-\$800,000.



Currently, Maranatha builds fully blocked churches in several of the countries where we are working. These sanctuaries have a steel frame and roof, cement foundation, walls, windows, doors, and platform. Some models even have bathrooms and Sabbath School classrooms. These churches range in cost from \$20,000 to \$75,000, depending on the size and country.



#### Wells

Water is a critical need in several of the countries where Maranatha is working.
Millions of people have little to no access to clean water, and they are suffering as a result. This year, Maranatha is focused on providing water wells in Zimbabwe and Kenya. The cost of a water well depends on the country. In Zimbabwe, sponsorship starts at \$10,000. Call to learn more.
