Location: Aiken, South Carolina, USA Project Dates: October 5 - 20, 2016



Thank you for your interest in the Aiken Open Team project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants.

## **Project Overview**

The Aiken Seventh-day Adventist congregation is in need of a new church building. They have twenty acres on which to build, but they haven't been able to raise the funds to complete the project. With the help of Maranatha volunteers, their prayers will be answered. Volunteers will help with the wood framing and siding of the 6,000 square foot new church as well as the rough electrical and plumbing work.

#### **Accommodations**

There is space for approximately 40 volunteers on this project. Please plan on bringing your own bedding and air mattress or pad. Volunteers who need housing will be staying with local church members. There are also a few RV sites with water, electric, and sewer hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV.

#### **Expenses**

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Aiken. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

## **About Aiken, South Carolina**

#### **Attractions**

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes to appreciate local sights and activities. Feel free to make your own arrangements for some of these or other popular area attractions.

**Hopelands Gardens** | Hopeland Gardens is located near the center of the town of Aiken, SC. Lovely trails, lots of shade filled with many trees and plants. There is some history as this used to be a private residence. Free to the public.

**Augusta Canal Interpretive Center at Enterprise Mill** Augusta Canal is a National Heritage Area, a place designated by the U.S. Congress that best represents an important theme in American history. Augusta Canal tells the story of the Industrial Revolution in the American South. Built in 1845 to harness the water and power of the Savannah River, this canal brought textile and other manufacturing to the region in the era before, during and after the Civil War. Augusta Canal is the oldest continuously operating hydropower canal in the US.

#### Weather

In October, temperatures average from low to high 70's, but can dip into the 40's at night. So be prepared for all types of weather, and be sure to bring a light jacket. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Aiken.

## Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

#### **AIG World Wide Insurance Coverage**

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges; however, it does carry a \$250 per occurrence deductible for dental charges.

#### Maximum Benefits:

Accidental death or dismemberment \$75,000

Medical/dental expenses \$100,000

Medical evacuation \$250,000

Repatriation (in the event of a death) \$25,000

## **Purchasing Maranatha Insurance**

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on North American Projects.
