Location: Long Creek, Oregon, USA Project Dates: September 5 - 16, 2016

Arrive on September 5 and start work on September 6



Thank you for your interest in the Long Creek Church project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

A small group of 20 skilled volunteers will construct a new church building for this congregation, along with three classrooms. They will help with the wood framing and siding as well as window installation, and rough electrical and plumbing work.

Accommodations

A few volunteers can stay in church members' homes, and there is also an RV park nearby with 12 parking spots.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Long Creek, Oregon. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and some local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for arranging their own meals and accommodations for any time outside of the project dates.

Weather

In September, temperatures average from mid to high 70's, but can dip into the 50's at night. So be prepared for all types of weather, and be sure to bring a light jacket. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions.

Travel Information

Flights

If you are planning on flying to the project, the closest airport is Tri-Cities Airport (PSC), 150 miles away. Unfortunately, because of the distance from the airport to Long Creek, you will need to rent a car and drive to the site. Please check with the airport for rentals before booking your ticket.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

AIG World Wide Insurance Coverage

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges; however, it does carry a \$250 per occurrence deductible for dental charges.

Maximum Benefits:

Accidental death or dismemberment	\$75,000
Medical/dental expenses	\$100,000
Medical evacuation	\$250,000
Repatriation (in the event of a death)	\$25,000
Dental expenses	\$250 (per tooth, per accident)

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission trips are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on North American Projects.
