Thank you for your interest in the Union Springs Academy project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

Union Springs Academy is located in Union Springs, New York. Union Springs Academy was founded in 1921. Over the years the campus has grown to include buildings for administration and classrooms, dormitories, church, faculty housing, farm, orchard and athletic facilities. For more than nine decades Union Springs Academy has provided quality Christian education to young people from New York, New England, Canada, and abroad.

This year, Union Springs Academy is asking for Maranatha's help with renovations. This includes landscaping, painting, carpet removal, laminate floor installation for the boys and girls dorm rooms, as well as install fire-rated doors in dorm rooms. Volunteers will also be pouring concrete for new sidewalks.

Accommodations

There is space for 75 volunteers on this project. If you request local housing, arrangements will be made for you in the dormitories. Beds are provided, but please remember to bring your own pillow, twin sheets, blankets, and towels to use during the project. There are also 35 RV sites with partial hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from the project. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Attractions

There are a few places you may want to visit while in the area.

Frontenac Park: A perfect spot for a nice walk. The park sits on Cayuga Lake. You can see birds, geese, and occasionally a heron.

Frontenac Historical Society & Museum: Free admission and some days there are scheduled events.

Great Gully Nature Preserve: Only three miles away. There are two large falls and two smaller cascades. The full ravine is about four miles long and up to 150 ft deep. There are a few defined trails along the creek. Best time to visit is during late spring, summer, and fall.

Please note, volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Please make your own food and housing arrangements for some of these or other popular area attractions.

Weather

Average temperatures in July range from the low 60's to low 80's Fahrenheit, but plan for just about any type of weather. Rainstorms are fairly common in July, so pack rain gear and a warm jacket just in case. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Union Springs, New York.

Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges.

Accidental death or dismemberment \$75,000

Medical/dental expenses \$100,000

Medical evacuation \$250,000

Repatriation (in the event of a death) \$25,000

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on North America Projects.


