Location: Prescott, Arizona

Thank you for your interest in the Camp Yavapines project, one of our many efforts based in North America! Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

Camp Yavapines has been serving children, youth, and adults since 1947. The facilities offer a variety of accommodations, ranging from quaint cabins and bunk lodges to RV and tent sites. Arizona and the surrounding states have enjoyed a long history of a ten-day annual camp meeting at Camp Yavapines. The camp is in need of continual maintenance and repair to ensure it remains an active summer camp and retreat center. With Maranatha's help, Yavapines is able to focus available funds on materials for repairs and not on labor, which stretches their limited means to complete necessary projects.

On this project, volunteers will divide into several teams to complete renovation projects around camp including drywall work, plumbing, roofing, landscaping, painting, framing, and concrete work.

Accommodations

There is space for approximately 60 volunteers on this project. Volunteers will stay in the beautiful cabins at Camp Yavapines. There are also many RV sites with full hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Prescott. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

About Prescott, Arizona

Attractions

Nestled within the majestic pines of Thumb Butte and adjacent to Prescott National Forest, Prescott is a beautiful region of Arizona. Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes to appreciate local sights and activities. Feel free to make your own arrangements for some of these popular area attractions.

Watson Lake | This beautiful lake is located just four miles north of downtown Prescott. The recreation area includes hiking trails and picnic tables as well as bike, kayak, and canoe rentals.

Prescott Peavine National Recreation Trail | Winding through the Arizona brush and the impressive Granite Dells, this 9-mile, level trail is perfect for biking or hiking.

Prescott National Forest | Explore this forest, which is comprised of 1.25 million acres of diverse landscape. The Sonoran desert dominates the lowest elevations, but as the elevation rises, junipers and Ponderosa pine dominate the area. Throughout the forest there are hiking and camping opportunities.

Weather

During April, temperatures for Camp Yavapines average in the 60's Fahrenheit but can dip into the low 40's and 30's in the evenings and early mornings. Rainstorms are not common in April, so the trip should be fairly dry. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Prescott.

Travel Information

Flights

If you are planning on flying to the project, the closest airport is Prescott Regional Airport (airport code PRA), a 15-minute drive from Camp Yavapines. You can also fly into Phoenix (PHX), but you will need to take a shuttle to Prescott so that camp staff can meet you and take you to the camp.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

AIG Insurance Coverage

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges; however, it does carry a \$250 per occurrence deductible for dental charges.

Maximum Benefits:

Accidental death or dismemberment	\$75,000
Medical/dental expenses	\$100,000
Medical evacuation	\$250,000
Repatriation (in the event of a death)	\$25,000

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on projects in North America.
