Thank you for your interest in the Maplewood Academy Open Team project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

Maplewood Academy, a co-educational boarding school, had its beginnings in Minneapolis, Minnesota, in 1888. It started in the basement of the Lake Street Church before it was later moved to Anoka and called the Minneapolis Industrial School. In 1904, it moved once more to Maple Plain and was renamed Maplewood Academy. The General Conference Committee voted in 1928 to unite the academy with the Hutchinson Theological Seminary in Hutchinson, Minnesota. The academy continues to operate and provide education for students in grades nine through twelve.

The campus is aging, and it is the goal of Maplewood Academy to provide the best possible environment for its students. Please join us in renovations on this campus that will include the bathrooms in both of the girls and boys dormitories.

Accommodations

There is need for 40 volunteers on this project. Preference may be given to those that are able to stay for the entire project. Volunteers who have requested housing will stay in the dorm rooms, guest rooms, and community member homes. There are also 40 RV sites with full hookups available to those bringing their RVs.

Attractions

Hutchinson and its surrounding area offers an endless array of things to do on vacation. Outdoor pursuits include fishing, boating, golfing, and biking. There are excellent museums of all types and options for live theater. And great shopping is nearby, including Mall of America, the state's most visited attraction and only an hour away.

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes to appreciate local sights. You are responsible for making any plans outside the actual project dates. This includes food and housing arrangements.

Weather

In May, average temperatures for Hutchinson are in the low 40's to low 70's Fahrenheit, but plan for just about any type of weather. Of course, weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current conditions.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

AIG World Wide Insurance Coverage

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a secondary policy, which means all claims will first be processed through your primary policy.

This secondary policy does not have a deductible for medical charges.

Maximum Benefits:

Accidental death or dismemberment \$75,000

Medical/dental expenses \$100,000

Medical evacuation \$250,000

Repatriation (in the event of a death) \$25,000

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the secondary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided free of charge to Maranatha volunteers on North American Projects.
