Thank you for your interest in the Living Hope Adventist Church Project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America project provide lodging and meals to participants.

Project Overview

Plummer, Idaho, is located centrally on the Couer d'Alene Indian Reservation. Seven years ago, several Seventh-day Adventist families moved to Plummer and started a small church in a member's home. Today, they meet in a rented church. Their unique location has given them the opportunity to share God's love with a community that has often received prejudice rather than acceptance.

In 2013, Maranatha framed a new church building for the Living Hope Adventist congregation. Now in 2017, the church has the necessary funds to complete it and needs Maranatha volunteers to help with siding, insulation, and sheetrock.

Accommodations

There is space for 25 volunteers on this project. Volunteers will stay with local church members during the project. There are also five RV sites with partial hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Plummer, Idaho. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are provided by the Living Hope Adventist Church in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form and will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we can not accommodate all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten free, etc) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Plummer

Attractions

Plummer is close to abundant wildlife and fowl for sport and observation. Fishing, boating, canoeing and other watersports are common among area lakes and rivers. Visit www.cityofplummer.org for a list of attractions and other events.

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Feel free to make your own arrangements for some of these or other popular area attractions.

Weather

In July and August, volunteers should experience beautiful weather. Average daytime temperatures are expected to be in the high 80's (degrees Fahrenheit) during the day and mid 50's in the evening. Evenings can be cool, so bring a light jacket. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Plummer, Idaho.

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

All volunteers will be covered by accident insurance from the time they arrive at the project until their departure. This is a primary policy without a deductible.

Purchasing Maranatha Insurance

Maranatha mission trips are construction projects where people can get hurt. Accident insurance is essential. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the mission project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to purchase the primary coverage that we carry. The cost of this coverage is provided by the Living Hope Adventist Church for Maranatha volunteers on North American Projects. The insurance brochure, with the policy information, will be sent to you in the final information email after you have registered and have been confirmed for this project.
