CONFLICT IN ANGOLA

1960 1975 1990 2005

1961 An anti-colonial guerrilla movement against Portugal results in war.

1975 Angola wins independence from Portugal.

1975 Conflict and civil war breaks out between three nationalist movements.

1992 Guerilla war begins again; next decade continues to be turbulent.

1991 Peace deal signed but not before more than 350,000 Angolans die in battle.

2002 Civil war comes to an end after 27 years of conflict; more than 500,000 lives lost.
