Ever wonder how a Maranatha project gets started? How do we choose which country to assist and where volunteers work? Here's a look at the process, from the moment we receive a request to the ribbon-cutting at a dedication.

PLANNING THE EFFORT

1

Regional leaders in the church survey community needs and plot a plan for efficient construction.

Maranatha visits a sampling of sites. We research the community's needs and the feasibility for volunteers and construction, including access for trucks and equipment.



Church leaders meet with Maranatha to go over request details, expenses, budget, and safety.

Maranatha moves leadership and crews into the country to prepare sites and oversee construction.

GETTING THE WORD OUT

Maranatha opens the project to the public and begins major fundraising efforts and volunteer recruitment.

After volunteers leave, crews do finish work on buildings. This can include prep work for a future volunteer painting project.



Projects begin. Volunteers arrive to build and minister alongside local church members.

When all work is done and buildings pass inspection with Maranatha, keys are passed to owner.
