Maranatha Volunteers International is a not-for-profit 501 (c)(3) organization headquartered in Roseville, California, mobilizing volunteers to participate in humanitarian services. Our mission is to spread the Gospel throughout the world as we build people through the construction of urgently-needed buildings.

Each year, Maranatha works with organizations, internationally and in the United States, to provide volunteer labor for various construction and renovation projects. The Redwood Area Camp (CA) Project is one our many efforts based in North America.

### **Project Overview**

The first meeting of the Redwood Area Camp was held on a summer weekend in 1951 in Redwood Creek. Since then, Redwood Area Camp has expanded to 100 acres of land and about 1,700 campsites. It says in the Bible that the "trees of the field shall clap their hands." Every year at campmeeting, attendees get a taste of just that. Some of the tallest trees in the world grow in Humboldt County. This area also features six rivers, one of which is on the border of the camp. Storage facilities, vehicles, trailers, and other improvements make

the Redwood Area Camp one of the nicest locations where Seventh-day Adventists from Northern California and the western United States can gather together and worship in God's sacred out-of-doors. Volunteers are needed to help with wood cutting, painting, renovations, and general cleanup. Please consider joining this project before this year's camp meeting!

#### **Expenses**

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Redcrest, California. Three vegetarian meals a day and accident insurance are provided by Redwood Area Camp in exchange for your volunteer labor.

#### **Allergies and Dietary Restrictions**

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on the registration form and will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we can not accommodate all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten free, etc) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

#### **About Redcrest**

#### **Attractions**

Redcrest, located in Northern California, is part of the Redwood Coast and is located on the world-famous "Avenue of the Giants". The Avenue of the Giants is a 32-mile scenic drive that winds its way through the redwood trees of Humboldt Rewoods State Park.

Redwood Coast offers the Redwood National Park, other Redwood Parks, drive-through trees, beautiful hikes, and camping along scenic drives. For more information on 101 things to do and details on the above attractions, please visit www.redwoods.info.

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own plans, this includes your own food and housing arrangements for any time outside the project dates.

#### Weather

Average temperatures for June average in the mid-high 40's to high 60's Fahrenheit, but plan for just about any type of weather. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Redcrest, California.

#### **Flights**

Once you have registered and have been confirmed, please plan to arrive on May 4, 2018 and depart on May 13, 2018. If you are planning on flying to the project, the closest airport is Arcata-Eureka (ACV), a 50-minute drive from the camp. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated.

#### **AIG Insurance Coverage**

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

### Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This, is in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.
