Maranatha Volunteers International is a nonprofit, Christian organization focused on providing churches, schools, and water wells around the world. A portion of the projects utilize volunteers on short-term mission trips to complete the work. Annually, we mobilize more than 2,000 volunteers to assist with various service opportunities and partner with thousands of donors to fundraise for international projects. Maranatha's mission is to spread the Gospel throughout the world as we support people through the construction of urgently-needed buildings. In North America, Maranatha aids by recruiting and organizing volunteer labor for construction and renovations projects at schools, churches, and camps.

The Milo Academy (OR) project is one of our many efforts based in North America.

Project Overview

Milo Adventist Academy was built in the 1950's. Maranatha has held four projects since 2015 on the Milo campus to help them complete renovation projects as well as helped build new cabins at Camp Umqua. Camp Umqua is used for student retreats, outdoor school, and campouts as well as special events held at the Milo campus such as camp meetings and pathfinder events.

Volunteers on this project will help complete work that needs to be done on the cabins and in the dormitories. This includes carpet removal, interior design, demo, framing, drywall, interior paint, floor covering, plumbing, electrical, exterior paint and landscaping.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Milo Academy, Days Creek, Oregon. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are provided by Milo Academy in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Days Creek, Oregon

Attractions

Southern Oregon is a great place to find outdoor adventure.

Rogue River: The Rogue River winds through much of southern Oregon, and Hellsgate Jetboat Excursions is one company that offers jet boat tours up the canyon. This fully narrated trip zooms up the river on large passenger boats and provides gorgeous views of the scenery. There are chances to see deer, river otters, bald eagles, and more! This is considered the excursion in the area. Tours are run out of Grants Pass, Oregon, about an hour from Milo.

Brandon Beach: Located about two hours from Milo on the Pacific coast, Bandon Beach is one of the best beaches in the area to enjoy the ocean views.

Crater Lake: Located only about an hour and twenty minutes from Milo, this pristine mountain lake in an old crater has beautiful views from the crater rim and hiking trails, as well as water access, for those who enjoy swimming, boating, and fishing.

Horses-Milo Adventist Academy: This spot has horses on campus that are used in the equestrian program at the school. There are trails around the campus. If you are interested in trail riding please request upon arrival.

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

Weather

Temperatures in July average in the 70's and 80's but can dip into the 50's at night, so bring a light jacket just in case. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Days Creek, Oregon.

Travel Information

Flights

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on June 17 and depart on July 1. The closest airport is Rogue Valley International Airport in Medford, Oregon (MFR), a 60 minute drive from Milo Academy. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated. AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be especially careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.
