Location: Chadron, Nebraska Dates: July 15 – August 3, 2018

(arrive on July 15, first work day July 16)



Maranatha Volunteers International is a nonprofit, Christian organization focused on providing churches, schools, and water wells around the world. A portion of the projects utilize volunteers on short-term mission trips to complete the work. Annually, we mobilize more than 2,000 volunteers to assist with various service opportunities and partner with thousands of donors to fundraise for international projects. Maranatha's mission is to spread the Gospel throughout the world as we support people through the construction of urgently needed buildings.

In North America, Maranatha aids by recruiting and organizing volunteer labor for construction and renovations projects at schools, churches, and camps.

The Chadron Adventist Church project is one of our many efforts based in North America.

Project Overview

The Chadron Adventist Church was built in the 1930's and is now in need of a new church building. They have

worked hard to raise the funds needed and are now excited they have reached the point of building on a new site—one that is on a hill that overlooks Chadron, Nebraska.

Volunteers will construct a new church building for the congregation. They will help with the wood framing and window installation.

Accommodations

There is space for 40 volunteers on this project. Volunteers who request housing will be hosted by local church members. Several (20-25) volunteers can be accommodated through local housing. There are also 8 RV sites with partial hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV and park on-site. There is also an RV Park, Eagles Rest, not far from the site for \$30 a night with full hookups. If housing is limited, priority will be given to volunteers who can participate the entire length of the project.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Chadron, Nebraska. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing through church members homes are provided by Chadron Adventist Church in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Chadron, Nebraska

Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

A few attractions within a 50 mile radius: Dawes County Historical Museum, Museum of the Fur Trade, Chadron State Park, Fort Robinson State Park, Toadstool Geological Park, Hudson Ming Bison Education and Research Center, Agate Fossil Beds National Monument. There are also about 30 hiking trails, a list of these can be found at facebook.com/NorthwestNebraskaTrailsAssociation.

The Black Hills of South Dakota, Mount Rushmore, Crazy Horse Memorial, Custer State Park, 1880 Train, Mammoth Site and Fort Laramie are also only about 100 miles away. Be aware that the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally is August 3-12, 2018 (400,00-800,000 bikers in the Black Hills that week)!

Weather

Temperatures for Chadron, Nebraska during June average in the low 40s to high 70s Fahrenheit. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Chadron, Nebraska.

Travel Information

Flights

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on July 15 and depart on August 3. The closest airport is Chadron Municipal Airport (CDR), a 10 minute drive from the church. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated. AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application. Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be especially careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.
