**SLAB** - A large concrete surface where a building is constructed.

**BLOCK** - Large bricks that are used to build most of Maranatha structures.

**MORTAR** - A mixture of lime with cement, sand, and water that acts like glue to keep the blocks together.

**SAND** - Sand is used to make mortar.

**TROWEL** - A tool that helps spread mortar.

**SAW\*** - Electric saws are used to cut blocks to the right size.

**LEVEL** - A tool used to make sure the blocks are flat to the ground and not tilted.

**CONCRETE** - A mixture of cement, water, and gravel, which is poured into the walls to make them strong.

**GRAVEL** - Used to make concrete.

**REBAR** - Long, steel rods built into the wall to make it very strong.

**GLOVES** - Protect the hands of Maranatha volunteers while they are working.

**GLASSES** - Protect the eyes of Maranatha volunteers while they are working.
