Location: Oshkosh, Wisconsin, USA Dates: Aug. 5 – 20, 2019

(Aug. 5 is the arrival date; no late arrivals or early departures can be accommodated)



Maranatha Volunteers International is a nonprofit, Christian organization focused on providing churches, schools, and water wells around the world. A portion of the projects utilize volunteers on short-term mission trips to complete the work. Annually, we mobilize more than 2,000 volunteers to assist with various service opportunities and partner with thousands of donors to fundraise for international projects. Maranatha's mission is to spread the Gospel throughout the world as we build people through the construction of urgently-needed buildings.

In North America, Maranatha aids by recruiting and organizing volunteer labor for construction and renovations projects at schools, churches, and camps.

The Oshkosh Camporee (WI) Project is one of our many efforts based in North America.

Project Overview

You can be part of one of the most exciting youth events in the world! Every five years, 50,000 Pathfinders from nearly 100 countries gather in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, to play, share, learn, and worship together.

Maranatha volunteers on this project will help with logistics, set up, and tear down of the structures for this large event. We are seeking 50 volunteers who can arrive before the Camporee and stay beyond the Camporee event to help with these projects. You must have your own RV or bring your tent. There are no other housing options. You must be able to stay for the entire duration of the project, August 5-20, 2019. We will not be able to accommodate late arrivals or early departures.

We can use contractors, plumbers, and electricians, as well as nurses to help with the nursing station. Volunteer helpers will also sew costumes for the evening programs, assist in the kitchen, and provide security during the evenings.

Accommodations

There is space for 50 volunteers on this project. Housing is not available for this project. There are RV sites with partial hookups and tent sites. Only volunteers who can participate the entire length of the project will be accepted.

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance will be provided by the hosting organization in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Oshkosh, Wisconsin

Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

Wiouwash State trail offers hiking, biking and horseback riding trails that span prairies and lakes. The southern part of the trail ends in downtown Oshkosh.

Menominee Park is located on the shores of Lake Winnebago and has beautiful views, picnic shelters, bike trails and even a petting zoo.

Grand Opera House is a small theater, opened in 1883, and brings in classical music artists and Broadway plays.

Paine Art Center and Gardens: This renovated, historic estate includes different art galleries such as painting, blown glass, tapestries, and woodworking pieces. It also features thousands of plants species in the botanical gardens.

Weather

Average temperatures for Oshkosh during August average in the 70's Fahrenheit but plan for just about any type of weather. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Travel Information

Flights

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on Aug. 5, and depart on Aug. 20; the closest airport is Appleton, Wisconsin (ATW), a 30 minute drive from the camporee. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, or outside the project dates, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated.

AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.
