Project Overview

Blue Mountain Academy is a fully accredited Seventh-day Adventist Boarding school for grades 9-12. It shares property with Kamp Keystone, a camp owned and operated by the Pennsylvania Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The campgrounds are used for annual camp meetings,



Accommodations

There is space for 60 volunteers on this project. Volunteers who have requested housing will be staying in dormitory rooms. 40 volunteers can be accommodated through local housing. There are also 25 RV sites with partial hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV. If housing is limited, priority will be given to volunteers who can participate the entire length of the project.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Blue Mountain Academy. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are provided by Blue Mountain Academy in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Hamburg

Attractions

Hamburg is a relatively small town located in eastern Pennsylvania. It is also located near several inexpensive attractions.

Coalmine Tours: Located a short distance from Blue Mountain Academy are several coalmines that offer spectacular views of ancient, petrified trees where John Baldwin of Andrews University has done research to date the flood.

Amish Community: Located just an hour from Hamburg, the Pennsylvania Amish of Lancaster County are America's oldest Amish settlement. Step back in time and visit the Amish countryside, shop for handmade crafts, and experience authentic cooking. There are also several Amish tours and buggy ride operators.

Philadelphia, **Pennsylvania**: Hamburg is located only two hours from Philadelphia. This large city is home to the iconic Liberty Bell, Independence Hall, the Philadelphia Phillies baseball team, and various museums and historical landmarks.

Hershey, Pennsylvania: Located only an hour away from Hamburg, "the sweetest place on earth" is home to the Hershey's Chocolate Factory, as well as many other attractions and cultural activities.

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

Weather

Average temperatures for springtime in Hamburg are consistently in the low 60's to low 70's Fahrenheit but plan for just about any type of weather. Rainstorms are fairly common, so pack rain gear and a warm jacket, just in case. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Hamburg, Pennsylvania.

Travel Information

Flights

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on April 15 and depart on April 29; the closest airport is Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE), in Allentown, Pennsylvania, a 35 minute drive from Blue Mountain Academy. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated. AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

The policy that volunteers are covered on depend on location of project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.
