This week, travel with us to São Tomé and Príncipe, an island-nation off the coast of Africa. Here, we'll meet a seven-year-old boy named Duarte. Duarte has a rare form of epilepsy called Dravet Syndrome, which can cause frequent seizures, developmental delays, and speech issues.

Duarte's mother wanted him to have a chance at a normal life, with friends and an education. In today's video, see how the prayers from Duarte's mom and a missionary from Brazil intersected to create a wonderful learning environment for him, and how Maranatha helped to make it last.
