This week, we go to the island of Cuba to meet a congregation that had been praying for a new church for 30 years. The Cardenas Seventh-day Adventist Church had a small building, but it wasn't big enough for the growing number of members attending each week. People overflowed the space, sitting in chairs outside the walls and standing at windows to get a glimpse inside.

Because the government in Cuba owns nearly everything, the members didn't have the resources needed to construct a larger space. They were stuck. So what did they do? They prayed.
