This week, travel with us to the West African country of Côte d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) where most people are not Christian. The majority religion here is Islam and the Marcory Adventist School has a number of Muslim students.

In today's video, your kids will meet two Muslim girls who attend Marcory. They talk about what it's like to have a different faith from most people at the school. We hope this episode will show your children how inclusivity and kindness can go a long way in sharing Jesus with the world around them.
