Everything changed one day when Helsy saw a flurry of activity across the street from his shop. It was Maranatha volunteers constructing a new church. He felt like God was sending him a message.

#### **Pre-video Discussion Questions**

- Do you sometimes feel close to family or friends, and other times you don't feel as close?
  Why do you think that is?
- Are there days you feel excited for church, but others when you are not? Why is that?

#### **Post-video Discussion Questions**

- It's normal for people to have a journey with God that changes over time. Although Helsy wasn't going to church anymore, how was he still connected to God?
- Why do you think the Maranatha volunteers made such an impact on Helsy?
- In the Bible, God spoke to people in different ways. For Elijah, God wasn't in any big, loud events (like wind, earthquake, or fire). God spoke to him in a gentle whisper. God may give us an idea from a conversation we have with a family member, from something we read, or when we pray. Like Helsy, how can you be ready when God is trying to tell you something?

## **Prayer Points**

- People who don't feel close to God right now.
- For us to be aware of how God might be speaking to us every day.
- Ask kids what they would add to the prayer list.
