Unfortunately, parts of their campus were in terrible shape. The dormitories, where the students slept, were nothing more than a rickety barn with a dirt floor. The shower was a fenced-in mud pit. There was no kitchen nor a dining hall. It's hard to imagine sending your own children to such a school.
