


Sunset Lake Camp (WA) Project

Information Packet

Location: Wilkeson, Washington Dates: October 14 – 23, 2020 (arrival date is Oct. 14 and departure date is Oct. 23)



Maranatha Volunteers International is a nonprofit, Christian organization focused on providing churches, schools, and water wells around the world. A portion of the projects utilize volunteers on short-term mission trips to complete the work. Annually, we mobilize more than 2,000 volunteers to assist with various service opportunities and partner with thousands of donors to fundraise for international projects. Maranatha's mission is to spread the Gospel throughout the world as we build people through the construction of urgently-needed buildings.

In North America, Maranatha aids by recruiting and organizing volunteer labor for construction and renovations projects at schools, churches, and camps.

The Sunset Lake Camp project is one of our many efforts based in North America.

Project Overview

Sunset Lake Camp is a moderately sized camp in North America that provides programming to more than 700 kids each summer. In addition, it hosts Seattle Children's Hospital, local police, and dozens of other groups.

The camp employs four full-time staff, but only one full-time maintenance worker. With the increasing age of the more than 60 buildings spread out over 390 acres of land, repairs have become a priority.

Volunteers will renovate a house. This includes a bathroom

and a kitchen remodel. We can use volunteers with skills in the following: flooring, electrical, plumbing, sheetrocking, cabinet installation and painting.

There is space for 15 volunteers on this project. Most volunteers who request housing will stay in cabins and will need to bring their own bed linens and towels. There are also a few guest

<u>Wednesday, Oct. 14</u> Arrival and orientation

<u>Thursday-Friday, Oct 15 - 16</u> Work Days

<u>Saturday, Oct. 17</u> Sabbath

<u>Sunday-Thursday, Oct. 18 – 22</u> Work Days

<u>Friday, Oct. 23</u> Depart from Camp rooms at the camp. There are also 5 RV sites with partial hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV. If housing is limited, priority will be given to volunteers who can participate the entire length of the project.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Sunset Lake Camp. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are provided by Sunset Lake Camp organization in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Washington

Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities. Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

A few local attractions worth checking out: Mount Rainier National Park, Seattle Space Needle, Olympic National Park, Pike Place Market.

Weather

Average temperatures for Wilkeson, Washington during October average in the low 60's to low 40's Fahrenheit. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Wilkenson, Washington.

Flights

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on:

Arrival | Please plan to arrive in Seattle, SEA-Tac International Airport (airport code SEA) on Oct. 14 by 6 pm.

Departure | Please plan to depart from Seattle, SEA-Tac International Airport (SEA) in the morning of Oct. 23.

The camp is 45 miles from the airport. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated. AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

Maranatha requires that every volunteer have a current Tetanus vaccine (within the last 10 years).
