Thank you for your interest in the Camp MiVoden project, one of our many efforts based in North America. Each year, Maranatha works with organizations in the United States and Canada to provide volunteer labor for various construction or renovation projects. Typically, these North America projects provide lodging and meals to participants. After reading this information packet, you can register online and join us at Camp MiVoden!

Project Overview

Nestled in the mountains of Idaho and on the shore of beautiful Hayden Lake, Camp MiVoden is the summer home for hundreds of campers each year. Along with being a summer camp, Camp MiVoden is also a retreat center that welcomes church teams, youth groups, and Pathfinder clubs for a relaxing getaway. While the setting of this camp is gorgeous, the large numbers of annual visitors has caused much wear and tear on the camp.

Volunteers will assist with several renovation projects including rebuilding some of the dock, repairs in the Equestrian Center, flooring and trim remodel in one of the cabins, cleaning up grounds as well as many other maintenance items.

If you know how to sew and can bring sewing machines to use on the costumes, that would be greatly appreciated.

Accommodations

There is space for approximately 60 volunteers on this project. Volunteers will stay in the beautiful cabins and dormitory at Camp MiVoden. There are also fourteen RV sites with electric and water hookups available for those wishing to bring their RV.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Hayden Lake. Three meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are free in exchange for your volunteer labor.

About The Pacific Northwest

Attractions

The American northwest is a great place to find outdoor adventure. Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project conclusion to appreciate local sights and activities. Feel free to make your own arrangements for some of these or other popular area attractions.

Riverfront Park: Located in downtown Spokane, this park occupies 100 acres of land and water. There are pathways along the river and near waterfalls, sculpture parks, nice picnic areas, and ponds with ducks to feed. There are also many attractions in the park including a sky ride over Spokane Falls, a carousel, an IMAX theater, and amusement rides.

Northwest Museum of Arts and Culture: This museum in Spokane features five exhibition galleries highlighting regional history and American Indian culture.

Mount Spokane State Park: Located about an hour from Camp MiVoden, this state park is nestled in nearly 14,000 acres of the Selkirk mountains. Activities include hiking and biking, horseback riding, and snow activities in the winter.

Lake Coeur d'Alene: Located only about 30 minutes from Hayden Lake, this pristine mountain lake has beautiful water access. Activities include exploring the nearby parks, swimming, taking a lake cruise, hiking on the trails, and shopping and eating at the nearby resort.

Tubbs Hill Nature Trails: Located in downtown Coeur d'Alene, this two mile trail loop is an easy way to get a taste of the northwest wilderness. The loop has several historical points along the way.

Weather

Average temperatures for Camp MiVoden during May average in the low 40's to high 60's Fahrenheit, so plan for just about any type of weather. Rainstorms are fairly common in May, so pack rain gear and a warm jacket just in case. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Hayden Lake.

Travel Information

Arrival and Departure

Please plan to arrive at Camp MiVoden on May 2 to get acquainted and settle in. Please plan to depart from Camp MiVoden on May 9.

We would like you to stay for the entire project, but don't let that stop you from registering and attending. When you fill out the registration form online, you can let us know what dates you are available to join us. Please wait to make travel arrangements until you have been confirmed.

Flights

If you are planning on flying to the project, arriving May 2 and departing May 9, the closest airport is Spokane, Washington (airport code GEG), approximately 45 minutes from Hayden Lake. Please wait to purchase tickets until you have been confirmed. We recommend you book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

The policy that volunteers are covered on depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.
