In North America, Maranatha aids by recruiting and organizing volunteer labor for construction and renovations projects at schools, churches, and camps.

Volunteers will construct a 6,000 square ft new church building for the congregation. They will help with the wood framing, siding as well as roofing and window installation.

Accommodations

There is space for 50 volunteers on this project. Volunteers who request housing

will be hosted by local church member. 15 volunteers can be accommodated through local housing. There are also several RV sites with full hookups available at the church for those wishing to bring their RV. There is a RV Park, Maple Hill RV Park and Cabins, three miles from the site for additional RV parking and housing. If housing is limited, priority will be given to volunteers who can participate the entire length of the project.

Expenses

The only costs to volunteers are the travel expenses to and from Jamestown Adventist Church. Three vegetarian meals a day, accident insurance, and local housing are provided by the Jamestown Adventist Church in exchange for your volunteer labor.

Allergies and Dietary Restrictions

Maranatha provides three vegetarian meals each day. We ask for your allergies on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate your needs. However, we cannot meet all special requests. If your diet is restrictive (vegan, gluten-free, etc.) we recommend that you bring items such as soy milk powder, gluten-free bread, etc. to supplement the meals provided by the cooks.

About Jamestown

Jamestown was established in 1823 as a county seat for Fentress County. It was incorporated as a city in 1837. Both Fentress County and Jamestown are named for prominent local politician James Fentress (1763–1843).

Jamestown was built upon the site of a semi-permanent Cherokee village, which probably made use of the many natural rock shelters in the area.[7] Before the founding of Jamestown, the area was known as "Sand Springs" for the many bubbling springs located within the city. The last remaining spring is located in the Mark Twain City Park, just northeast of the county courthouse. This spring provided water to the family of John M. Clemens, father of noted author Samuel L. Clemens (Mark Twain), before they moved to Missouri.

Attractions

Volunteers may choose to arrive early or leave a few days after the project concludes in order to appreciate local sights and activities: Big South Fork Nat'l River and Recreation Area, Pickett CCC Memorial State Park, Northrup Falls Trails, Rugby Historic Village, Sgt. Alvin C. York State Historic Park, as well as many horse trails.

Volunteers are responsible for making their own arrangements, including food and lodging, for all days outside of the project dates.

Weather

Average temperatures for Jamestown during May average in the high 70's to low 50's Fahrenheit but plan for just about any type of weather. Rain is fairly common in May, so pack rain gear and a warm jacket, just in case. Of course, current weather conditions can change at any time, so we recommend that you check the 10-day forecast before leaving to ensure that you are prepared for the most current weather conditions in Jamestown, Tennessee.

Once you have registered and been confirmed, if you are flying to the project, please plan to arrive on:

Arrival

Please plan to arrive in McGhee Tyson Airport (airport code TYC) before 6 pm on July 14.

Departure

Please plan to depart from McGhee Tyson Airport (airport code TYC) in the morning/early afternoon of July 30.

McGhee Tyson Airport is a 90 minute drive from the church site. Please book flights that come in before 6 p.m. on the arrival date. If you need to fly in later, please check with the Maranatha office to confirm that your arrival time can be accommodated. AIG Insurance Coverage

Maranatha mission projects are construction projects where people can get hurt. It is not possible for Maranatha to analyze everyone's insurance policy to see whether his or her insurance is current and the coverage is in effect at the location of the project. The Maranatha Board of Directors decided that the safest route was to require everyone to be covered by the insurance coverage through Maranatha's carrier. For projects taking place in North America, the cost of this is covered by the hosting organization.

All volunteers will be covered by this insurance policy from the time they depart for the project until they return home. For volunteers who have extended travel by arriving before or staying after a project, the insurance would start and end on the Maranatha project dates based on the project application.

Insurance coverage depends on location of the project and home residency of the volunteer. Both policies are primary policies that do not have a deductible. As with all insurances, exclusions apply. An insurance brochure with the policy information and list of benefits will be sent to you in the confirmation email for this project.

Safety

Maranatha has a very high safety record on the worksite. This is, in part, because we require everyone on the construction site to wear a hard hat and gloves at all times. Please also wear appropriate safety equipment for the work tasks and wear sturdy shoes. Exercise caution while working on the construction site and be careful when working on or around ladders or scaffolding.

Maranatha requires that every volunteer have a current Tetanus vaccine (within the last 10 years).
