Dear Parents,

This week, come with us to the African nation of Zimbabwe, where we'll meet two ladies who must walk an hour each day to collect water. Elizabeth and Rhoda have dedicated much of their lives to this essential resource, but their families depend on them to continue walking those miles each week. However, if they didn't have to spend so much time gathering water, there would be more time for their families, education, and careers.

Today, the ladies are excited because Maranatha has arrived to drill a well. Watch as the drilling crew is forced to make a tough decision—do they drill past the depth that the geology report expects them to find water, or pack up and move to the next site? We hope your children see how they can turn to prayer in situations that are out of their control.
